6th Grade Adventures at Science Camp



Earlier this week, our 6th graders enjoyed a 3-day Science Camp adventure at Marin Headlands.

When I asked one of our 6th grade students, Jessica Ho, what she learned at camp, Here's what she said...

"We learned about ice plants and how they are invasive plants, meaning they invade the area where they grow so other plants cannot grow. We also did the "ice plant roll" where we rolled down the hill to keep the ice plants from taking over so that other native plants can grow there, too. We also went to the Marine Lab. We had had to wash our hands thoroughly because any dirt on our hands could destroy the animals that live in the lab. We also got to touch certain animals that wouldn't hurt us, like a star fish and mussels.

We hiked up a very steep mountain that was very tiring and easy to fall off the edge if you didn't pay attention. We also went on a "terrifying" night hike with no flash lights! I was scared because I almost crashed into the side of the railing along the road. I enjoyed this Science Camp very much because I learned to overcome my fears and I met lots of new kids my age. We ate breakfast and dinner with our new friends."
