Here are some expressions that you can use to talk about the weather. Read them together with your parents or guardians.

Hace sol. (It's sunny.) Hace frío. (It's cold.) Hace calor. (It's hot.) Hace buen tiempo. (The weather is good.)
Hace mal tiempo. (The weather is bad.)
Hace viento. (It's windy.)

Point to each weather symbol and ask your parents or guardians to choose an expression from the box to tell you what each one means. Tell your parents or guardians that they can choose more than one expression for each symbol. Then switch roles and have your parents or guardians point to each symbol for you to tell what it means.









Now teach your parents or guardians how to ask about the weather today and how to answer the question. First, read the question and have your parents or guardians say it after you:

¿Qué tiempo hace hoy?

What's the weather like today?

Think about what the weather is like today and look for an expression in the box to answer the question. Have your parents or guardians repeat your answer. Then switch roles with your parents or guardians and have them ask the question for you to answer.
