Make index cards for the numbers 11–20. Write the number on one side and the Spanish word for the number on the other side. Put the cards in order and hold them up one by one. Ask your parents or guardians to say the word for the number. Then have your parents or guardians hold up the cards one by one for you to say the number.

Teach your parents or guardians how to ask and answer this question. Hold up one card and show your parents or guardians the number. Ask the question and answer it yourself first. Then hold up another card and ask your parents or guardians the question. Congratulate them if they can answer it!
