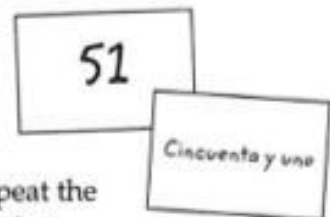

Teach your parents or guardians the numbers 51–60 in Spanish. Read each number aloud and have your parents or guardians say it after you.

Make a set of flash cards. Write a number on one side of a notecard and the Spanish word on the other. Put the cards in order and hold them up one at a time, with the number side showing. Ask your parents or guardians to say the number in Spanish. Then have your parents or guardians hold up the cards for you to say the number. Repeat the activity and make it a little more challenging by mixing up the cards before you begin! Then keep the cards in a safe place to use again.



Now teach your parents or guardians how to read an addition problem in Spanish. Read the problem and solve it yourself first. Then have your parents or guardians read the problem and solution after you. **¿Cuánto es _____ más _____?** (*How much is _____ plus _____?*)

Then write several addition problems on a piece of paper and have your parents or guardians read each problem aloud.

Now teach your parents or guardians how to say these letters in Spanish. Read each letter aloud and have your parents or guardians repeat it after you. (The pronunciation of each letter is in parentheses. And remember that the **h** is always silent in Spanish!)

h (hache), **j** (jota), **k** (ka), **l** (ele), **ll** (elle), **m** (eme)

Practice the sounds of the letters. Read aloud the words below and have your parents or guardians repeat after you. Can your parents or guardians tell you the meaning of each word in English?

h (as in *hour*): **hola, hermano, hija**

j (like the *h* in *home*): **julio, garaje, jardín**

k (found only in foreign words): **kayak, karate, kiwi**

l (as in *love*): **lápiz, libro, reloj**

ll (like the *y* in *young*): **gallina, caballo, gallo**

m (as in *map*): **mamá, semana, comedor**
