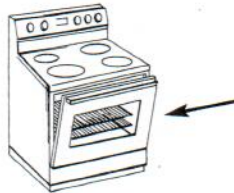

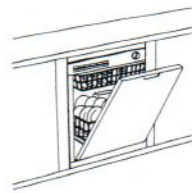
Teach your parents or guardians the names of appliances in Spanish. Look at the pictures together and help your parents or guardians read each word after you. Don't forget to say **el** or **la** before each word!

Cover up the words and point to each picture to see if your parents or guardians can name each appliance. Then have them cover up the words and point to each picture to see if you can name each appliance, too!

Have your parents or guardians help you make Spanish labels for appliances using sticky notes or small slips of paper. Then use the sticky notes to tag the appliances in your home so that for one week you and your family can refer to them by their Spanish name.

Now teach your parents or guardians how to say these letters in Spanish. Read each letter aloud and have your parents or guardians repeat it after you. (The pronunciation of each letter is in parentheses.) t (**te**), v (**ve**), w (**doble ve** or **ve doble**), x (**equis**), y (**i griega**), z (**zeta**)

Practice the sounds of the letters. Read aloud the words below and have your parents or guardians repeat after you. Can your parents or guardians tell you the meaning of each word in English?

t (as in *toy*): **techo, ático, televisor**

v (like the *b* in *book*): **vaca, vestido, oveja**

w (found only in foreign words) **web, week-end, walkman**

x (like the *x* in *six*): **examen (exam), exacto (exact), taxi**

y (like the *ee* in *seed*): **hoy, voy, hay**

z (like the *s* in *six*): **pizarrón, brazos, diez**

Say the alphabet from a to z with your parents or guardians.
