Teach your parents or guardians the numbers 41–50 in Spanish. Read the numbers and have your parents or guardians say them after you.

41 cuarenta y uno

46 cuarenta y seis

47 cuarenta y siete

48 cuarenta y ocho

49 cuarenta y nueve

50 cincuenta

Make a set of number cards for the numbers 41–50. Write the number on one side and the Spanish word on the other side. Put the cards in order and hold them up one by one. Ask your parents or guardians to say the number—in Spanish!

Now add this set of cards to the one you made for the numbers 1–40 to play **¿Qué número es?** Shuffle all of the cards and place them number-side up on a table. Take turns with your parents or guardians taking a card from the top of the pile and asking the question: **¿Qué número es?** Whoever answers the question correctly using the expression **Es el** (*number in Spanish*) gets to keep the card. Continue until all fifty cards have been picked up. Whoever has the most cards at the end wins!

Have your parents or guardians count aloud, in Spanish, the number of jelly beans in the jar below.

Practice the sound of **u**. Remember that **u** in Spanish has the same sound as the *oo* in *boot*. Point to each picture and ask your parents or guardians to read the three words to the right. Then help them match the picture with the correct word.

The sound of **u**

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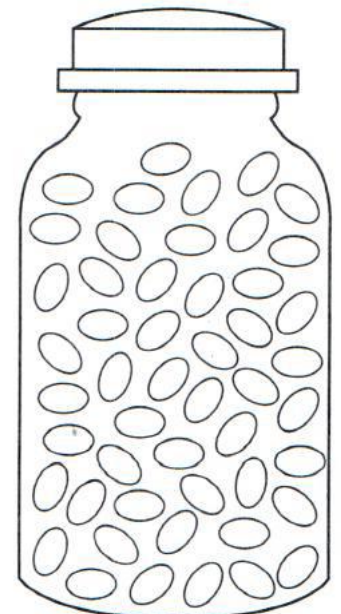
