They must be 4 years old by October 1st of 2026. Some children are eligible for 30 hours per week based on specific factors.</p> <p>This session will help you understand how to enroll your child in this program for the 2026-27 school year which can save parents about \$6000 per year in childcare costs. Registration began December 9, 2025.</p> <p>The presentation will take about 20 minutes, so there's lots of time for questions.</p>
