Extended Day

Our Extended Day program, also known as Before and After Care or B&A, allows busy working families the flexibility to drop-off before the school day starts and pick-up after the normal dismissal time. Our program is organized into five subject areas that are designed to provide your child with opportunities to learn valuable life skills, and to reinforce the skills they're learning during the school day, while providing plenty of time for fun with friends.

Extended Day

Our program is organized into five subject areas that are designed to provide your child with opportunities to learn valuable life skills and to reinforce the skills they're learning during the school day.



Students explore the exciting world of science, technology, engineering, art and math (STEAM) through building projects, experiments, and design challenges. Sharing ideas, asking questions, and making predictions are encouraged!



Robust outdoor free play and structured games help students build physical strength while learning the values of teamwork and sportsmanship. Through board games and team challenges, students also develop critical thinking and problem-solving skills as they collaborate with their peers. The “Commons Lounge”, designed for students in grades 5–8, offers a variety of engaging activities including board and tabletop games, card games, and a limited selection of video games. In addition to social play, students have the option to read, work on homework, or simply spend time talking with friends. By fostering both choice and connection, the Commons Lounge creates a welcoming space that promotes social interaction and community among our older students.



Students express themselves by participating in hands-on visual arts, including, drawing, painting and more. Students develop planning skills by working on projects with their peers. Activities are designed with student age in mind, and an emphasis is placed on materials explorations.



Social and emotional growth is nurtured through student and teacher led activities that promote a feeling of community and belonging. Students learn through open-ended activities that give them a chance to apply problem-solving skills and collaborate with friends.



At Midtown, all K-8 students are provided study hall regardless of enrollment in the extended day program. During study hall, we provide students a quiet place to work on homework, read, journal, or seek academic support from peers and teachers. Students in K-5th grades have study hall from 3:00-3:45PM.
